**Thomas Bill Hit As Discriminating By Verein Units**

Opposition to the Thomas Bill, Federal School aid measure was voted at a joint meeting of Rochester Branches, Catholic Central Verein of America and National Catholic Women's Union held Sunday at St. Michael's hall.

The meeting directed that letters be sent to the United States senators from New York, expressing the opposition of the Branches to the bill, stating that the measure in its present form discriminates against parents of children in denominational schools, and in effect, reduces them to the status of second-class citizens.

Stanley Paprinkis, Chairman of the Convention Ways and Means Committee, announced a benefit party to be held at St. Peter and Paul's Hall on Thursday, April 28.

DISCUSSION OF THE Declaration of Principles adopted at the Milwaukee Convention of the Central Verein was continued.

The sections of the Declaration entitled "Freedom of Education" and "The Call of Justice and Charity" were presented by Joseph H. Gervais, Attorney. He stressed particularly that portion of the Declaration which warns of the danger inherent in the belief that the child belongs to the State.

The declaration states that this belief is put into practice under Communist rule and that in the United States powerful influences are working toward the same end. "What they really are working for however, is the establishment of atheism in the State and Nation by driving God out of state and school."

August M. Maier, President of the Men's Branch, presided at the meeting.
