

NC Aims Told At Diocesan Board Meeting

A discussion of the institution of the National Catholic Welfare Conference was presented by the Rev. Albert Shannon, Diocesan Moderator of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, at the quarterly meeting in Elmira last Sunday.

The bishops tell the need of teaching all Catholics, and to do this the two federations, the National Council of Catholic Men and the National Council of Catholic Women, were formed, said Father Shannon. "Through these lay groups the bishops of the United States project service to God and the Nation."

HE EXPLAINED how the bishops, meeting in Washington, passed along to the lay through NCCM and NCCW, their official stand on spiritual, material and moral questions, and their solution to the difficulties.
