(Continued from Page 7) tion and group activities were offered to 1,079 men, women and children at Charles House with total attendance of 22,303. Genesee Settlement offered facilities to 32,845 through clubs, classes and teams and 102 visits were made to homes in the neighborhood.

Eighty different girls received 10,851 days' care at St. Elizabeth's Guild House. In addition to the eight Catholic agencies, other Red Feather services include Association for Blind, Cerebral Palsy Association, Tuberculosis and Health Association, Legal Aid Society and others numbering 46 in all. The U. S. O., American Cancer Society and American Heart Association are in the piaz organizations to which Chest funds will go this year.

Campaigners will point out to give that prices for the supplies the agencies must buy are in general higher now than they were a year ago. Some of the agencies will have to hire new employees to meet the pressure of the rising demand for their services. "It costs more to do more," campaigners will show. The Red Feather appeal is 46 local appeals in one. In addition, the Rochester and Monroe County Quotas of five national agencies are included in the 19-49 Community Chest budget. Giving to the one appeal will be less than to give to 46 plus 5 campaigns, leaders declare.
