> IN THE MEANTIME, the Red regime imprisoned all the Greek Rite Bishops, declared the Greek Rite Church "reunited" with the schismatic Orthodox Church, "suppressed" three of the five Latin Rite dioceses and "deposed" three Latin Rite Bishops: Archbishop Alexander Cisar of Bucharest and Bishops Augustine Pacha of Timisoara and John Scheffler of Satu Mare and Oradea Mare. The two Ordinaries still permitted to discharge their duties were Bishop Marton and Bishop Anthony Durocovici of


