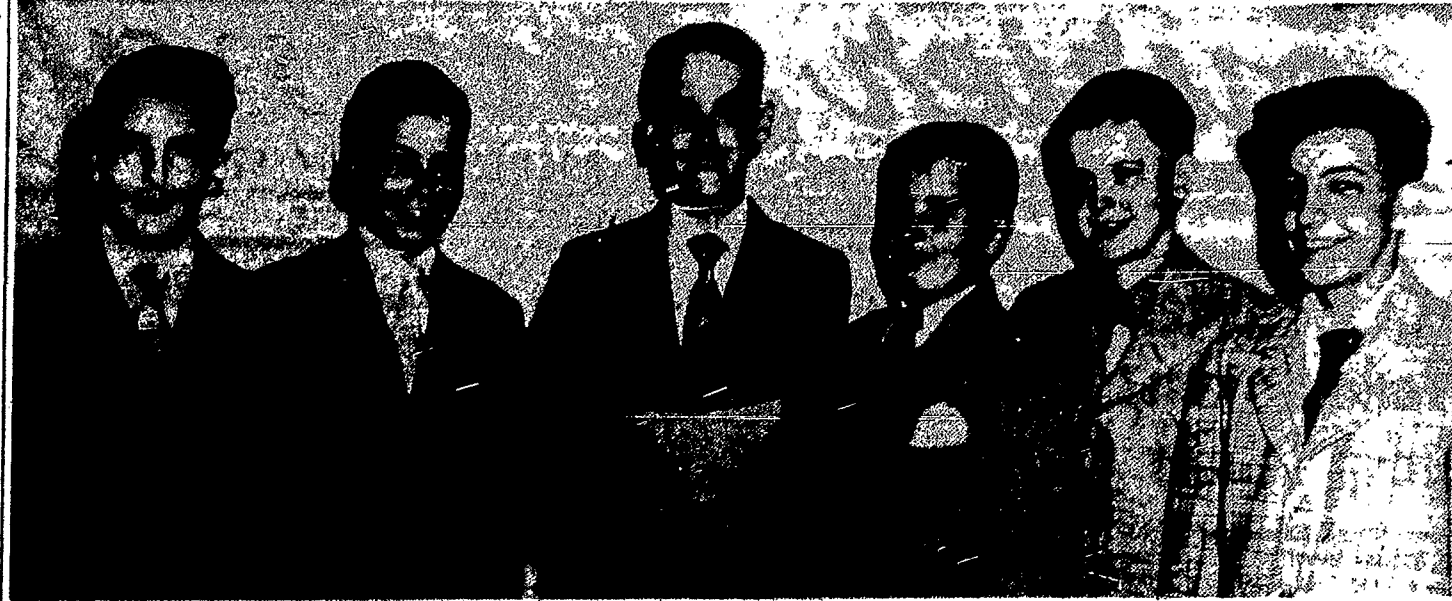

Third Order Of St. Francis

Visitors or prospective members will be welcome at the Third Order of St. Francis meeting Sunday, May 22 at 3:30 p. m. in St. Patrick's Church, Plymouth Ave. North, according to officers.
Franciscans are always urged to be on their guard against undue attachment to the goods of this world, officers state. A writer in The Franciscan Forum paraphrases Monsignor Knox's "Primer of Perfection" on this point as follows:
"We have to be on our guard lest excess in these necessary gratifications clog us with imperfection. Not sin, mind you, but imperfection is not a sin, but it is a retarding, a drag on the way to the higher life of the Gospel. We have to watch ourselves lest we become too attached to this or that comfort, to this or that type of food, to this or that style. ...
"This is clearly indicated in the Third Order rule, according to which members pledge themselves to observe the golden mean proper to each one's state in life, avoiding excess in all their manner of living, limiting indulgence and expense on amusements, as well as on food and clothing and all creature comforts. They are to lead a moderate and mortified life."
The program of the Third Order:
"To commit no sin in heart or hand for the sake of goods of fortune.
"To observe moderation in acquiring and enjoying goods of fortune.
"To administer all goods of fortune in such a way that they will serve the common good no less than personal advantage."
