The Caecilians of St. Monica's Church will present the popular Gilbert and Sullivan opera, "Iolanthe," on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, May 24 and 25, in the parish hall.

The scene of the opera is laid in England in the midst of the pageantry of court life. It is a fantasy based upon intrigues among peers of the English Parliament. The story deals with the Lord High Chancellor who is about to give in marriage his ward, Phyllis, to the peer of her own choice. However, Phyllis dashes all hope when she announces that her heart is already given to an Arcadian shepherd, Strephon.

The Chancellor gives vent to his anger and swears revenge on this lad who has dared to defy his high command: Strephon is the son of Iolanthe, the fairy, who disobeyed the royal commands and married a mortal. Her death sentence is commuted only on the condition that she leave her husband at once without explaining her identity. She does so and goes to live at the bottom of a stream to be near her son, Strephon, half-fairy and half-mortal, calls upon the fairies in his effort to win Phyllis.

THE PLOT DEVELOPS with the Peers and Fairies constantly bickering and quarreling. However, all circumstances finally lead to a happy ending in which both Peers and Fairies are contented.
