**J. P. MacSweeney Honored for Work In Health Group**

MR. MACSWEENEY SAID this week that he was happy to accept the office of honorary president in an organization he has seen grow from a committee whose primary purpose was the prevention of tuberculosis, to a strong, indispensable, voluntary general health organization carrying on a program not only in the tuberculosis field but also in the prevention of heart diseases, venereal diseases as well as in eye conservation, school health, nutrition and other phases of health.

Commenting on Mr. MacSweeney's work the "Democrat and Chronicle" stated editorially: "In local and state associations, Mr. MacSweeney has been a vigorous and effective leader."

Highlights of his work are: he served as a member of the Board of Directors; he was chairman of the Health Education Committee; he served as chairman of the Rochester Committee and was president of the association for 9 years.
