Scouters To Travel Trail Of French Missionaries

History repeated itself this week as French "explorers" arrived in Rochester preparatory to setting out by canoe to rediscover the famous American and Canadian sites connected with the explorations of the early French missionaries. The "explorers" are four French scoutmasters who are stopping over in Rochester before beginning a 4,500-mile trek over the route followed by Father Marquette in the 17th century. They are Jean Raspaill, Jacques Bouchariat, Philippe Andrieu and Yves Korbondau, all Catholic scouters of France. While here they will undoubtedly visit the locations historically connected with the French missionaries in this vicinity, including the site of the first Mass said in the territory by Father Hennepin, indicated by a plaque on the campus of Mercy High School, and the place where the first French mission was built, identified by the Alhambra plaque erected near Lima. THE FRENCH scoutmasters have charted a course which will take them across Canada and the U. S. from Three Rivers to New Orleans, by the St. Lawrence, and the Ottawa rivers, Lake Superior and Lake Michigan, the Fox, the Wisconsin and the Mississippi rivers. They will leave Three Rivers in two 16-foot war canoes on a journey plotted to last about eight months, or until about February, 1950. Known as the Marquette Team, the group planned the trip to honor Father Marquette, discoverer of the Mississippi River, and to cement friendship between American, Canadian and French youth. During the journey, the team will deliver brass commemorative plates to dignitaries in the cities of Quebec, Detroit, Marquette and Chicago, the gifts of the city of Leon, France, birthplace of the French explorer.
