This correspondent personally witnesed a 23-year old Portuguese girl, who had been bedridden for five years with spinal tuberculosis, stand up immediately after the blessing of the sick with the Blossed Sacrament by American Bishop Sidney M. Meizger of El Paso, Texas.

The girl later walked to the medical bureau where doctors examined her and expressed satisfaction at her condition.
