EACH CHILD has been a real member of the family. The Hepworths' joy doing things with the children. Mr Hepworth, for example with his "boys" has fixed up toys - some for the use of the children in the home - some to give to less fortunate children.

Always the children have shared in the activities of the family from the Sunday auto ride to the vacation in the mountains. "We always do things together" was Mrs. Hepworth's comment.

The Hepworths are proud of being foster parents. "People ask me - Don't you get tired of it?" Mrs. Hepworth said, "I don't - The more babies I've had, the more I love each one." "I don't understand it myself - but the more I've had, the more attention I give them, and the more I love them."

Mr. and Mrs. Hepworth are typical of the over 150 foster mothers and foster fathers who have opened their homes and their hearts to children under the care of Rochester Catholic Charities.

DURING THE past year about 400 Catholic children have been deprived of their own homes because of parental illness, death, and other reasons. These children must find the love, the security, the Christian ideal of family life in the homes of their substitute parents.

The children needing these homes are of all ages - from infants awaiting adoption placement to teen agers. They are both boys and girls.

Some children remain with their foster parents through many years - sometimes until they are ready to be married and to establish homes of their own. Others remain a short time until conditions in their homes are right for them to return.

Japan 'Twilight Christians' Meet Pontiff's Legate

Nagasaki, (NC)—The "Twilight Christians" of Nagasaki and the Goto Islands have agreed to send 20 representatives to meet His Excellence Norman Cardinal Gilroy, Archbishop of Kyushu, Australia, who is acting as Papal Legate to the Xavier Centennial here.

These schismatic Christians, numbering perhaps 50,000, descended from early Catholics forced underground by 17th century persecution. When a priest at Nagasaki was allowed to enter Japan more than 200 years later thousands came forward as Catholics, having kept the doctrine, prayers and traditions intact through generations. But these other thousands remained aloof and unchristian.

on an equal footing with other children in the family. There can be no barriers, either mental or physical which would leave the foster child on the outside looking in when it comes to any of the family activities. The Charities workers know that being a foster parent is a hard job, but that without foster parents the agency could not care for its children.

BEFORE A CHILD is placed in the foster home is thoroughly investigated by Mrs. Sarah Keller, homemaker of the Catholic Charities Staff. The home must meet the requirements set up by the State Welfare Department.

Foster parents must have a complete physical examination, must have reasonably secure economic status, must live in a wholesome neighborhood, accessible to church and to school.

The agency pays the foster parents weekly board for each youngster, and supplies clothing, medical care, and incidental expenses. The homes are limited to no more than six children per home, and not more than two under 2 years of age.
