### Rochester K. C. Member Elected State Warden

Rocco F. Natalie, 38 Child Street returned from the New York State Convention, Knights of Columbus held over the week end in Syracuse as State Warden. He was elected with the other state officers at the closing session.

Also from the Rochester diocese area elected were Frank J. Kelly, Hornell, a delegate to the Supreme Convention in Portland Oregon, and Frank J. Cuddy, Auburn, a supreme convention alternate.

Natalie is the first state officer elected from Rochester Council since 1906, according to Grand Knight John J. Kinney who headed the delegation.

Winners of state scholarships announced at the convention were Boys, Cornelius James O'Connell, (Canisius High School, Buffalo and Girls, Margaret Mary Schmiegel, St. Anthony of Padua High School, Syracuse.

THOMAS H. GREEN, of 595 Seneca Parkway finished second after O'Connell. In the girls division, Marjorie M. Klem, 33 Langford Road was third and Eleanor C. Conheady, 140 Curtis St., seventh. Nazareth Academy girls according to District Deputy Francis T. Toomey the other Rochester delegate.

Matthew F. Kennedy of Brooklyn was elected State Deputy to succeed William E. Burke of Utica, a supreme director.

OTHER OFFICERS named were State Secretary, E. Bartley Boyle, Port Jervis; Treasurer, Joseph A. Smith, New York City; State Advocate, Thomas L. Fitzgerald, New York City and Natalie, State warden.

Climaxing the sessions was the state dinner at which Supreme Knight John E. Swift of Boston cited the opportunity ahead for Catholic laymen banded together as are the Knights of Columbus. He urged a membership of 1,000,000 Knights.

The present controversy of Federal Aid to schools was discussed by State Deputy Burke whose topic was "Are Catholic Children American Children?" He cited pending bills excluding Catholic schools from participation in welfare funds.

"It is Anti-Catholic and anti-American to discriminate against the children of Catholic schools," the State Deputy said.

"They are full fledged American citizens. They will be qualified to vote eligible for public office, subject to military service and obligated for public taxes.

"They are a cross section of American life bright and dull, rich and poor colored and white. They are typically and wholly American."
