### Nun, Native Of Auburn, Wins Grant

Auburn — The St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing Scholarship for advanced study at Catholic University, Washington, D.C. which is awarded annually to the graduate who has secured the highest average in her class in the New York State licensing examination was this year awarded to Sister Ann Francis, a member of the Franciscan Sisterhood whose Mother house is located at 1024 Court Street in Syracuse.

Sister Ann Francis is entering the convent as Dorothy M. Carmody. She is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Carmody of 71 Holley Street. The former Auburnian has the distinction of having secured an average of 99% the highest average ever to have been made by a graduate of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing in the state licensing examinations according to records on file in the school.

### Ceylon Overrules Ban Against Pope's Talk

Colombo, (Ceylon) (NC) — An English language recording of an address by His Holiness Pope Pius XII denouncing anti-religious minority regimes for their persecution of the Church and religion was finally broadcast over the Colombo Radio after the Ceylon cabinet overruled a ban imposed on it by C. Sittampalam, Minister of Posts and Telecommunications.

The Pope's speech, delivered before a gigantic Catholic Action gathering in Rome, had been interpreted as a denunciation of the Hungarian regime for its action against Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty. Mr. Sittampalam had banned the broadcast on the promise that it was an attack on Hungary with which Ceylon is on friendly terms.

The Ceylon press was generally critical of the Minister's action and widespread public disapproval of his attitude finally led the Ceylon cabinet to take up the matter.

### Largest Church Organ Munch (NC)

The Cathedral of Passau on the Danube prides itself on having the largest church organ in the world. It took four years to build and was first played in 1928.
