

U. S. Delegate Backs Vatican Envoy On God

Geneva, (NC)—At the diplomatic conference here for the protection of victims of war the American delegation has supported the delegation of the Holy See in urging the mention of the name of God in the proposed pact.

The delegation of the Holy See has suggested that in the preamble to the convention for the protection of the civilian population reference should be made of the divine origin of the rights to be safeguarded.

Speaking for the United States, delegate Albert E. Clattenberg, Jr., declared that his delegation "strongly supports the proposal of the Holy See that our preamble shall expressly recognize the dignity and rights of man derived from God."

The principal object of the convention, as the preamble before us says, is to protect the civilian population from the horrors of war, by provisions and regulations which have as their basis the natural law, the law of nations and above all else, the principles which have as their source the precept of charity.

Pilgrims Honor Japan Apostle Catholic Daily At Atom-Blasted Hiroshima

Hiroshima, Japan — (NC) — This city, still showing the terrible effects of the atomic blast, gave a warm welcome to His Eminence Norman Cardinal Gilroy, Archbishop of Sydney and Papal Legate, and the international group of pilgrims on their arrival for ceremonies here forming part of the Xavier quadricentennial celebration.

AS IN THE five other cities already visited by the pilgrims the governor of the prefecture and the city's mayor personally greeted the Cardinal and the pilgrims.

Banzai Cheers Given Pontiff

Hiroshima, (Aboard the Xavier Special), — (NC) — When this pilgrimage train pulled into the dimly lit, and rain-soaked station after midnight, some 200 Japanese Catholics were lined up on the platform awaiting a hymn in honor of St. Francis Xavier.

As a priest brought the saint's relics from the train they fell on their knees for a blessing. Then led by their pastor, the group including children and young women with babies, made the station reverent with three Banzai cheers each for St. Francis Xavier and Papa-Nona (the Pope). As the train left they were waving the Ave Maria.

The relic of St. Francis Xavier, brought by the Spanish delegation, was placed on the altar of the church where the atomic bomb fell. Here special services were held with Cardinal Gilroy presiding and some 1,500 attending.

Pope Pius Gives Conditions For Holy Year Indulgences

Vatican City — (By Radio, NC) — The Papal Bull officially proclaiming "a great and universal jubilee to be held in this beloved city from Christmas, 1949, to Christmas, 1950," sets forth the following conditions to be met by pilgrims in order to gain the Holy Year indulgences:

During this year of expiation, to all the faithful who duly confess their sins in the Sacrament of Penance, who receive Holy Communion and visit once on that day, or on different days, in the order of their choice the basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Peter's in the Vatican, St. Paul's on the Ostian Way, and St. Mary Major on the Esquiline, and recite in each basilica three times the "Our Father," "Hail Mary" and "Glory be to the Father," and as well one "Our Father," "Hail Mary" and "Glory be to the Father," for Our Intentions, and will add in each basilica a "Credo We grant and bestow in the Lord the full indulgence and pardon of all punishment due for sins."
