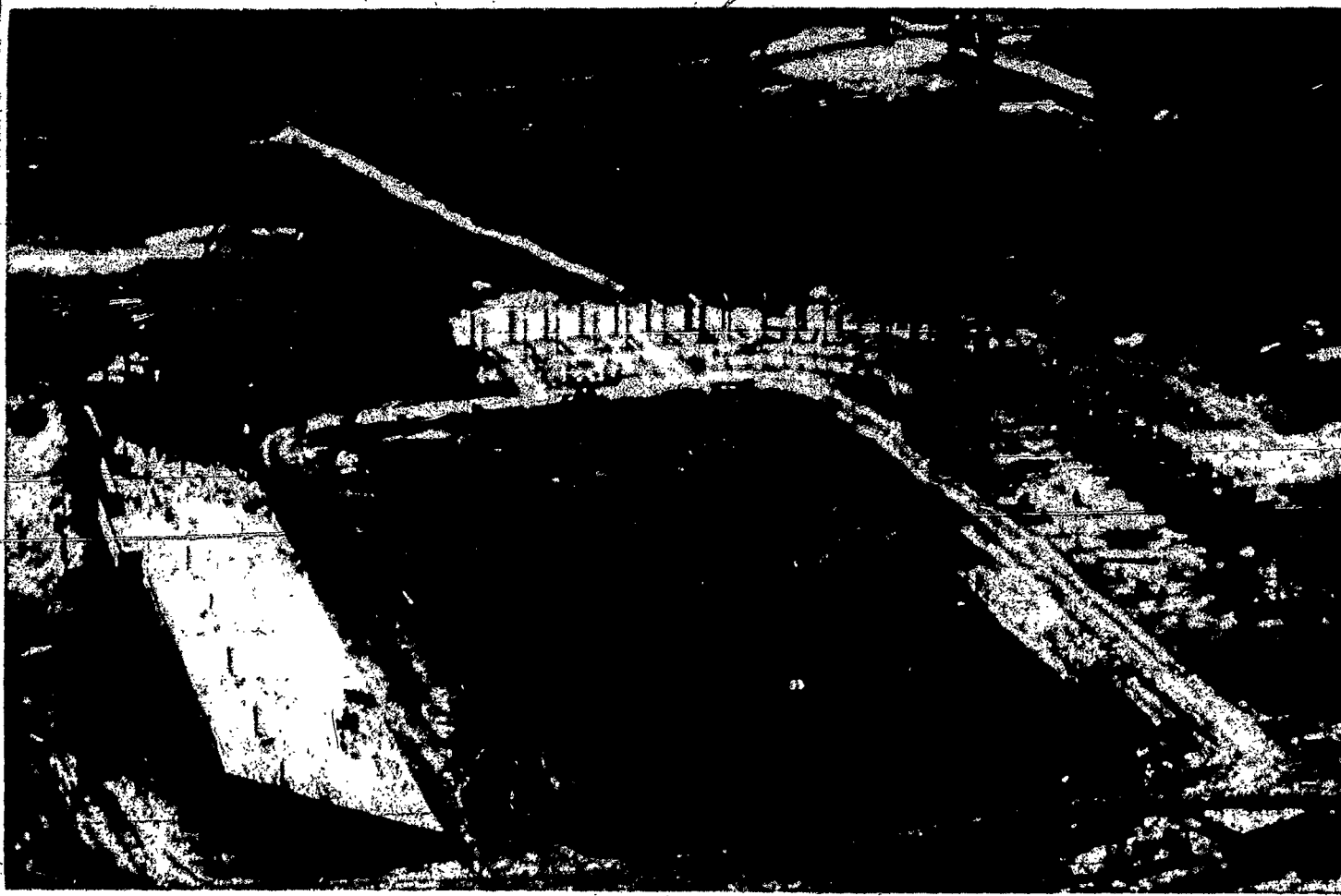


Aquinas Institute Football Stadium Rises

Rev. Fintan R. Shoniker, O.S.B., M.A., B.S.L.S., librarian and director of public relations at St. Vincent College, Latrobe, Pa., will join the faculty of the University of Portland for the 1949 summer session as a visiting professor of library science.

A native of Rochester, where he attended Corpus Christi School and St. Andrew's Preparatory Seminary, Father Shoniker has pursued graduate studies in library science at Notre Dame University Rosary College, and Columbia University.

Father Shoniker at the present time is chairman of the Western Pennsylvania Unit of the Catholic Library Association, chairman of the Library Section of the American Benedictine Academy, a member of the C.L.A. advisory board, constitution committee, and chairman of the publications committee.

Father Kaiser, Born Here, Sent To Germany Post

The Rev. Wilson E. Kaiser, native of Rochester and a priest of the Diocese of Great Falls, Montana, has accepted an assignment in Germany with the National Catholic Welfare Conference War Relief Service.

THE PRIEST WILL be an NCWC agent in charge of distribution of relief goods sent overseas. He also will be associated with the displaced persons program in the Berlin area. His temporary assignment is expected to last from one to two years, after which he will return to the Great Falls Diocese.

Father Kaiser was ordained in the latter diocese in 1940. First appointed to Sacred Heart High School in Miles City, where he taught Latin, aerobatics, biology, and religion, as well as coaching the basketball team. He was transferred in 1943 to Great Falls as assistant at St. Ann's Cathedral and as head of the Helsey Memorial.

He also has been diocesan director of the CYC, chaplain of the Columbus hospital, secretary-treasurer of the state AAU, Scout chaplain, moderator of the CSO and chaplain of the Serra Club.
