CYA Summer Day Camp Will Include Girls On Schedule

Annual summer Day Camp of the Columbus Youth Association will reopen on Tuesday, July 5 at the C.Y.A. gymnasium, 50 Chestnut Street. Registrations are now being accepted for both boys and girls of the 9 to 12 age groups.

The Day Camp is in operation daily, except Saturday and Sunday, from July 5 to August 26. The program features swimming, hiking, baseball, and other sports trips to parks, zoos, the museum, and other places of interest, and special indoor activities for rainy days.

Although last year's day camp was for boys only, there will be a special separate program this year for girls from 9 to 12 years of age. The girls Day Camp will run for the same period of time as the boys.

48 Polish DPs Awaited At Weedsport 'Community'

Forty-eight persons, Polish DP farmers, will come to live in the "community" established late last year in St. Joseph's Parish, Weedsport by the Rev. John Sliwowski, assisted by the pastor, the Rev. Leo A. Jones.

Thirty-seven of the persons coming will leave Englestadt, Bavaria for their trip to America and 11 will come from other camps. All are Polish Catholics and are certified by the Polish chaplains in those camps.

IN THE GROUP will be 13 children under 7 years of age and three are only a few months old.

Father Sliwowski, a priest of Lomza Diocese, Poland has increased the Community holdings on Emerson Road, Weedsport, to 100 acres on which are 100 cedar trees. With two houses of 24 rooms ready and new tractor machinery on the land, arrangements are being made to greet the arrivals.

Needs of the Community were stressed by Father Sliwowski, this week. He asks for old furniture, especially beds, mattresses, sheets, pillows, blankets, stoves, cooking utensils, dishes, knives, forks and spoons.

The Polish priest was visiting in America when he broke out cancelling his return to Poland. From 1943 to 1947 he was stationed in Tanganyika Territory, East Africa and administered to displaced persons there.
