### Catholic University Drama Group Plans Summer Plays in Henrietta

A summer theater program produced by young graduates of the Drama Department of the Catholic University of Washington will fill the rustic atmosphere of the Henrietta Hayloft with laughter, romance and tragedy beginning July 6, according to hopeful plans announced this week by directors of the troupe.

The 14 young actors and actresses who learned their theater skills at Catholic University will be known as the "Catholic University Players" during a nine week season, a new play each Wednesday evening and continue the run through Sunday evening.

The same group had a successful summer season in 1948 at Adrian, Michigan.

The Henrietta Hayloft, rented from the Rev. George Vogt, pastor of Good Shepherd Church, East Henrietta whose parish groups use it in the fall and winter for dances and roller-skating is on the West Henrietta Road Route 15, about three miles south of the Rochester city-line.

Installations for the summer plays will include a new stage, drapes, lighting facilities and sets. The Hayloft will seat 400 spectators easily and will be "very cool even on the hottest summer evenings," the young group promises.

Planned to be shown in future weeks are such popular hits as "Ladies in Retirement," "The Late Christopher Bean," "Pep of My Heart," "Barber of Seville," (not the opera), "Jennie Kismet," "Our Town," "Arms and the Man" and "Harvey."

Prime movers in the theater project who are making advance preparations for housing the company and reading the theater are Arthur Conescu and Dorothy Chermack of New York City and Robert O'Connor of the Pittsburgh. Other C.U. graduates and undergrads in the company are from New York, Chicago, Washington and Rochester.

### Catholic Theater Meeting To See New College Plays

Los Angeles - (NC) - A new drama by Emmet Lavery, playwright and former president of the Screen Writers Guild, will be among four new plays to be presented for deletion.

The plays, representing the best work now being done on the stages of the nation's Catholic colleges, will be presented by the original casts from four colleges. They will be produced in the theatre at Immaculate Heart College of Hollywood during each of the sessions of the convention.

MR. LAVERY'S play, "Song of the Sea," with a French Revolution setting, will be staged by Immaculate Heart College. DePaul University of Chicago will present "The Traitor's Gate," by Norma Stuart, and Boston College will stage the premiere of "Glorious Mystery," by Francis P. Moran.

Loyola University of Los Angeles will offer "Black Prophet," by a student, Samuel J. Larsen. Advanced reservations indicate that approximately 1,000 delegates and visitors will attend the convention's sessions.

### U. S. Priest To Direct Music For Holy Year

Pittsburgh - (RNS) - Father Carlo Rossini, a member of the Pious Society of the Missionaries of St. Charles and organizer at St. Paul's Cathedral here, has been called to Rome by Pope Pius XII to take charge of music for the Holy Year of 1950. He will leave for Europe in July.

The letter from the Holy See calling Father Rossini to the Vatican also announced his appointment as secretary general of the St. Cecilia Society, established in 1903 by Pope Pius X to promote approved church music.

WIDELY KNOWN as a composer and compiler, Father Rossini was born in Italy where he was ordained in 1913. He came to the U. S. in 1921, after having served as an Italian army chaplain in World War I. He has been in Pittsburgh since 1923.

He holds a master's degree in music from the Pontifical Institute in Rome, and has taught organ at Duquesne University and the Pittsburgh Musical Institute.

FATHER ROSSINI'S writings include some 15 Masses, more than ten volumes of choral compositions, three textbooks on Gregorian chant for use in schools, accompaniments for Gregorian Masses and hymns, and many collections of organ music for church use. The latter are said to be widely used by non-Catholic as well as Catholic organists.

During the Holy Year, Father Rossini will have charge of preparing and arranging musical programs for St. Peter's Basilica and the three other major basilicas in Rome.

### Legion Bans Foreign Films

New York - (NC) - Two foreign language movies - "Dedee," French film produced by the Vog Film Corp. and "Incorrigible," a Swedish movie of the Foreign Service Corp., have been placed in Class C, wholly condemned, by the National Legion of Decency, it has been announced.

The Legion listed as its objection against "Dedee," "its theme and treatment this film is grossly offensive to traditional standards of morality and decency. The morally low atmosphere pervading the story intensifies the sordidness of its presentation."

Regarding "Incorrigible," the Legion's objection stated: "The picture in the story that it tells is immoral in treatment. It presents indecent and suggestive situations. Also, the dialogue is suggestive and immoral actions are condoned."

### Human Reason Role Told To Thinkers

Paris - (NC) - "The Church has always defended the proper role of human reason," His Eminence Cardinal Suhard, Archbishop of Paris, told participants in this year's Intellectual Week, an international meeting of scholars and writers just held here.

"No more than it desires a theocracy, does the Church want an imperialism of thought which would dictate all that men might say. The Faith is never a school of timidity or narrow-mindedness."

### Jewish Leader Thanks Church

Cologne - (CIP) - At the dedication ceremony of the new synagogue here, Morris Fischel, president of the Jewish Community of Cologne, expressed the thanks of the Jewish population to the Catholic Church authorities which, under the Nazi persecution, rescued the Torah scrolls and preserved them from profanation by the Nazis.

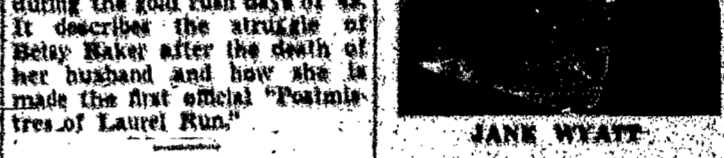
### Love Story of Brother Set For St. Francis Broadcast Sunday

### Youth Protests Get Film Reform

Rochester, N. Y. - (NCF) - A protest originated by youth groups against certain types of movies shown at local theaters bore fruit here. The protest was started by the Rochester Girl Scout Council supported by other youth groups, and was climaxed at a meeting between Mayor C. Wesley Lyons, clergymen and professional leaders and theater operators.

As a result of the meeting, Carmen Urcioli, operator of two theaters, and the district manager of an interstate chain of movies, promised to exert their efforts to present movies suitable for patrons of all ages.
