This message was given by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney to 13 graduates of St. James Mercy Hospital School of Nursing at commencement exercises June 9 in St. Ann's Church. The class was presented by the Rev. John Healy, hospital chaplain and diplomas were awarded each member by Bishop Kearney.

The Bishop said that holding commencement exercises in a church was indicative of the nurses' realization that the nursing vocation is more than a merely humanitarian or educational profession.

The attitude of unselfish devotion to ideals is in sharp contrast to the spirit of materialism which predominates in the world today, the Bishop continued. The socialistic trend of excluding God from civic and educational institutions is increasing with a corresponding weakening of moral standards.

THIS TREND is doubly unfortunate for this country, since it is a characteristic of the totalitarian form of government, rather than the American way of life, the Bishop declared.

"You in the nursing profession with its trials and temptations, need God. The difficult tasks which you will be called upon to perform will take on a beautiful and supernatural significance as you realize that in serving your fellow man you are serving the God who selected you for a nursing vocation," he concluded.

Commencement exercises opened with a solemn procession of altar boys, student nurses, graduates, members of the St. James School of nursing faculty, members of the clergy, Bishop Kearney, and candidates for graduation. The girls graduating yesterday entered in a single file, led by Miss Anne McKeever, superintendent of nurses.

ST. ANN'S GIRLS choir of 30 voices, directed by Sister Raymond Joseph, with Sister M. Gabriel as organist, sang "O Heart of Jesus, Heart of God" and "Immaculate Heart of Mary." The choir also sang "Pans Angelicus" and "Tantum Ergo" for Benediction.

Following the presentation of diplomas, Bishop Kearney imparted the Pontifical blessing to the graduates. Ceremonies closed with Solemn Pontifical Benediction. Bishop Kearney was celebrant, the Rev. Walter Fischer, deacon, and the Rev. Laurence Gannon, sub-deacon. The Rev. William Tobin was assisting priest. During Benediction the graduates recited, in unison, the
