Priest Urges 265 Men To Give Good Example Daily

Hornell—Americans are hero worshippers and good example will be emulated by them, the Rev. Charles Connell, chaplain of St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester told 265 Holy Name Society members and guests at a Father's Day breakfast at St. Ann's and St. Ignatius societies, Sunday, in the Moose banquet hall.

Father Connell talked on baseball and mentioned the thousands of young and old players of the game who flood through Yankee Stadium to view the body of Babe Ruth.

"Babe Ruth," he said, "was a perfectionist, an idealist loved by everyone. Americans have always had a love for that type of man and there will also be some here for us to follow."

FATHER CONNELL urged the members to "devote your manhood to giving good example and to fight the forces which are

dedicated to root out a love and loyalty for God." He said it has now become "criminal to love and be loyal to God" and cited the imprisonment of clergymen in European countries.

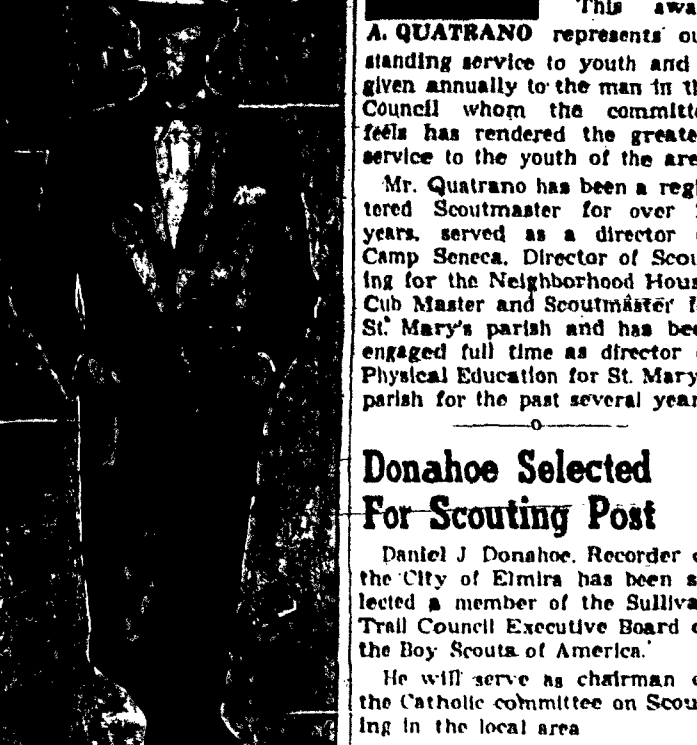
He told the members that each one could be a "hero" in his own family by living up to the principles of his faith, "hour after hour and day after day, being good Catholic men devoted to God and to country." He urged them to practice their faith, "perhaps sometimes striking out but always remembering we are Christians."

The Rev. William Tobin, spiritual director of the St. Ignatius group, gave the invocation and introduced the speaker. The Rev. John Haley, spiritual director of the St. Ann's society, led the group in the Holy Name Pledge. Piano music was played during the breakfast by Elhan Welch, Jr.
