CUA Scientist Wins Patent Infringement Suit

Washington - (NC) - Prof Louis H Crook, head of the de partment of aeronautical engin eering at the Catholie University of America since the depart ment's establishment in 1933, has won a patent infringement suit against the Government that is expected to involve many millions of dollars

The court of claims unanimous ly upheld Professor Crook's claim to the invention of an ignition sinerding system used furing the war in planes, tanks, command cars and other vehicles which made possible their reception and transmission of radio messages

Prolessor Crook, who is 61 owns 25 per cent of the patent. which expired in 1944. The court ruled that his patent was valid and that the Covernment infringed it in using the shield from 1937 until 1944. 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


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
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
