Challenge Is Given St. Bona Men At Breakfast

The modern world presents a "striking challenge" to Christian educated men, the Rev. Peter A. Carr, O.F.M., professor of history and religion at St. Bonaventure College, told 250 Rochester alumni and sons, students and fathers, at Hotel Seneca Sunday morning.

The "Father's Day" Communion followed Mass and corporate Communion in St. Boniface Church, where Father Carr celebrated the Mass and the Rev. Walter A. Kohl, pastor and an alumnus of St. Bonaventure, welcomed the group.

FATHER CARR who is assistant director of athletics at the college, reviewed world conditions leading up to the present chaotic condition.

The Franciscan friar urged the men to meet the modern challenge by being participators in the Christian revolution. "Wake up the hearts of men so that they can go forth and convert other men to the Christian way of life," he advised.

Four Christian social attitudes for lay apostles he cited were: family life, children, interracial justice and anti-Communism. Into these must be fused the Christian influence by men so living that their influence is felt, he said.

The speaker was presented by Norman A. O'Brien, toastmaster. Others who talked briefly included: Father Kohl, President Thomas J. Byrnes of the alumni, Co-chairman William Cuel for the alumni and William Bennett, students. Former football coach Mike Reilly was at the speakers' table.

The alumni, students and future students attended a picnic in the afternoon at Corbett's Glen.
