**Bishop To Dedicate New Chapel At Villa**

St. Thomas Chapel on the grounds of St. Joseph's Villa will be dedicated to the memory of Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey, second Bishop of Rochester, by His Excellency Bishop Kearney on Tuesday morning, June 21, at 10 o'clock.

An ornamental cornice mounted on the ceiling forms a canopy over the altar. The entire altar is in a deep ivory finish decorated in polychrome colors. The chapel has the appearance of a small mission church with a heavy tower rising above. Basement will be used for manual training for boys. Off the chapel is a vesting room and priest's study.

Leo P. Ribson is the architect and William J. Woernen and Sons furnished the altar and pews. St. Joseph's Villa, a cottage-type home for dependent boys and girls, was opened on Dewey Avenue when the children from St. Mary's and St. Patrick's Homes were moved there June 24, 1942.

Negotiations for the Villa were started by Monsignor Lambert Oct. 7, 1937. The Villa has become nationally known and was featured in "Church Property Administration," ten years later with air photographs and an article by Monsignor Lambert.
