Bishop To Dedicate New Chapel At Villa

St. Thomas Chapel on the grounds of St. Joseph's Villa will be dedicated to the memory of Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey, second Bishop of Rochester, by His Excellency Bishop Kearney on Tuesday morning, June 21, at 10 o'clock. The Mass will be celebrated at 9 a.m. Bishop Kearney will celebrate Mass in the beautiful little chapel, which was fashioned from a former workshop near the entrance of the grounds, Dowey Ave., Greece. Attending the Mass will be the Rt. Rev. Magr. Gerald C. Lambert, director of Rochester Catholic Charities, the Rev. Austin B. Hanna, Villa chaplain and Mr. and Mrs. Joseph G. Hickey. The Mass will begin at 9 a.m. A stucco building, the chapel has pews of oak and a communion rail and Sanctuary lamp of wrought iron. The altar is of tripartite style, so designated because the reredos is made in three panels. Decoration was inspired by Bishop Kearney and carries out a theme appropriate for the children of the villa. SET INTO the Gothic paneled front of the altar table is a medallion of the Infant Christ and the central feature in the tripartite panel is a picture of Christ blessing the little children.
