**Needy In Germany Thank Rochester Benefactors**

Pitiful stories of destitution and growing want in Germany highlight recent letters of gratitude for bundles of Rochester clothing, according to Harold J. Coleman, president of the Will Corporation, whose firm has packed and shipped overseas donations of Rochesterians for several years.

"A deeply grateful note from a convent in Junkeradorf near Cologne," said Mr. Coleman, "reported that the depreciation of German money had made 'most of the people wholly destitute.'"

"This correspondent said 'Many old people commit suicide each day here being very desperate.'"

RENEWING HIS company's offer to pay all expenses of packing and shipping relief bundles of clothing, he said that overseas needs are as great as ever. "The touching letters of thanks reveal how Europe needs our charity."
