'Blind Apostle' In China Guides Veteran Missionary

Lalpo, China — (NC) — One of the strangest stories to come out of this land of oddities concerns a blind man known as the "Blind Apostle," who has a job as guide to a white-haired missionary.

The missionary, The Rev. Joseph W. Regan of Fairhaven, Mass., is a Maryknoll priest stationed here. He asserts that he wouldn't be able to find half of the villages in this area without his guide.

"MY 'BLIND' apostle seems able to lead me to people who need help by instinct," said Father Regan.

He takes me to villages which I never knew existed, far off the main roads. Some are inaccessible by jeep or bike; others are so far distant from each other and from my home base that I would never have a chance to visit them. But the 'apostle' hears of people in these remote places who wish to see a priest and he directs me to them. Perhaps his lack of sight accounts for his uncanny sense of direction.

Father Regan, who has served in the mission fields of China for 20 years, credits his guide with scores of conversion. Reliable sources in the village say that this team, a white-haired Maryknoll missionary and a blind man, has been instrumental in the baptizing of several hundred pagans thus far this year.
