
He prayed that "these young women will always persevere in the first flush of enthusiasm that brought them here today," and that "God will always be with them."

Exert Catholic Influence, First Friday Men Urged

Auburn — Mobilization of Catholic influence, through such organizations as the Holy Name Society and the Knights of Columbus, is urgently needed today to counteract the increasing wave of anti-Catholic propaganda, members of the K. of C. First Friday Supper Club were told July 1.

"Only when Catholics exercise their proportionate influence in our communities will such anti-Catholic legislation as the discriminatory Harden Bill on federal aid to education be eliminated," Arthur P. Farren of Rochester, executive secretary of the Diocesan Holy Name Union, warned 40 club-members at the monthly supper in the Genesee Street clubhouse.

Events in Europe will never be repeated in America, the speaker emphasized. If Catholics here answer the call for lay apostles who will follow the pattern of Catholic Action — to "see, judge and act."

To KNOW the Catholic viewpoint on major issues, Farren stressed, it is necessary to be a regular reader of the Catholic Courier Journal and other Catholic publications. "Beyond this," he added, "is the necessity for action, for doing something about it. This, in my opinion, is what we lack today."

Farren spoke on "Reading Between the Lines." He was introduced by William Murley, the Rev. Charles G. Langworthy, who this week begins new duties as assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church here, also spoke briefly.

Murley announced that regular supper meetings of the club continue on First Friday through the summer.
