The Rev. Stefano Bianchi, O.F.M., S.T.D., B.A. who in September 1948 visited in Rochester enroute to China, will head a delegation of 228 Franciscans due in two weeks to set up a Seminary for the training of native men for the Holy Priesthood.

Their destination will be the spot picked by the Holy See for a proposed Pontifical House of Studies in the Orient.

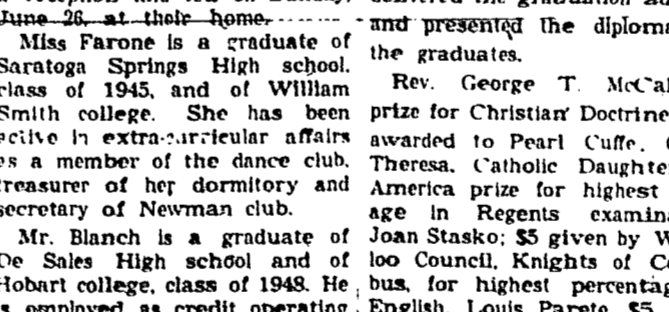
Father Bianchi who is a native of Villavallelonga, Italy received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Sienna College near Albany, this year.

When the Italian Franciscan priest visited Rochester last September he was honored by 400 persons at Powers Hotel and was presented with a gift of money and a typewriter, gifts of his townspeople.
