**Protestants Get Red Czech Lies**

New York (RNS)—Twenty leading Protestant public relations directors and editors were summoned to a press conference at the Czech consulate here where they heard attacks on the Roman Catholic hierarchy of Czechoslovakia.

Keynote of the conference was sounded by Dr. Vladimir Houdek, permanent delegate to the United Nations, who accused "the hierarchy of the Catholic Church" of efforts to win allies among other religious groups by insisting that Communism is determined to stamp out all religion.

"We are not against Christianity or any other religion," Dr. Houdek stated. "Our quarrel is only against those elements of the Catholic Church which are determined to frustrate the people's efforts to build Socialism."
