WINS NEWSPAPER AWARD

Poles Seek Beatification of Queen, Modern Priest Martyr

Warsaw - (NC) - The Church in Poland has taken new steps to promote the beatifications of one of its most modern and one of its medieval heroes.

A third canonical process has begun for the beatification of the Rev. Maximilian Kolbe, O.F.M. Conv. who gave his life in a Nazi concentration camp to save the father of a large family. His Eminence Adam Cardinal Sapieha, Archbishop of Cracow, issued a pastoral letter urging Catholics to observe the 350th anniversary of the death of Queen Jadwiga (Hedwig) of Poland on July 17, 1949, by praying for her speedy canonization. The man for whom Father Kolbe gave his life in the Oswiecim camp survived to tell the tale of the priest's death by starvation and injection of carbolic acid. Other inmates of the camp have corroborated his story.

ARCHBISHOP Stefan Wyszynski, Primate of Poland, opened the process in Warsaw. He told members of the tribunal they are entering on a serious task "standing on the boundary of two worlds, that of this earth and the world of glory." Forty-two witnesses on Father Kolbe's death are scheduled to be heard before the process is completed here.

In his pastoral on Queen Jadwiga, Cardinal Sapieha pointed out that she was responsible for the union of Poland with Lithuania and conversion of the Lithuanians.
