Lisbon Prelate Asks Laity To Aid Vocations

Lisbon — (NC) — The responsibility of providing priests for the Church of God falls not only on the hierarchy and clergy but on the laity as well. His Eminence, Emmanuel Cardinal Goncalves Cerejeira, Patriarch of Lisbon, stressed at the First Lisbon Patriarchal Congress for Recruiting Vocations.

The Cardinal declared that many of the Catholic laity had assumed an indifference toward the maintenance of seminaries and the cultivation of priestly vocations, and expressed the hope that the congress would impress on their consciences the present shortage of clergy in the patriarchate. The laity can help the cause of vocation, he related, by encouraging children toward a priestly life, by praying for vocations, by establishing a solidly Christian home which will inspire vocations and by contributing toward the support of priestly aspirants.

The prelate referred to vast stretches in the Lisbon area where there are neither churches nor priests, and added that because of this situation only about one-fifth of the school children come under the influence of the Church.

Japan Prime Minister Aids Catholic College

Tokyo — (RNS) — Impetus was given to a drive undertaken by Japanese friends of Sacred Heart University, a Roman Catholic institution here, for a new building when Prime Yoshida presided at a meeting of 22 of the leading promoters of the undertaking. Objective of the drive is to raise thirty million yen for the building.

Rep. Fogarty Gives Reply To Barden School Aid Stand

His bill would not even allow those States which are furnishing a few incidental services for nonpublic school pupils to use Federal funds for the same purpose.

The Congressman said that he had drafted his bill to avoid controversy. He said: "It seems to me that one way to avoid controversy — particularly religious controversy — in the school question is to help all school children, not just some of them. These services have no reference to religion."

HE SAID further: "I believe in the separation of Church and State. I have taken an oath to uphold the First Amendment. The Supreme Court of the United States has decided that public funds may be used to furnish non-religious textbooks and bus rides for children in both public and nonpublic schools. Therefore, in my bill there is no violation of the official American principle of separation of Church and State."

Mr. Fogarty also touched upon Mr. Barden's position that the Barden Bill does not discriminate against any religious group, since it provides money to be distributed solely among the public schools of the country.

His comment was: "I just can't see how a Congressman may close his eyes to the fact that a large number of American children attend religious schools. I think that we admit this fact when we count in these children for the purpose of computing the amount of Federal aid to be given to each State."

"The discrimination sets in when we forbid the States to use any of this money even to furnish school services for these boys and girls. For example, is it not discrimination to allocate to the State of New York \$5 for every one of its 400,000 and more nonpublic school pupils and then to forbid the State of New York to use one dime of this money for these children?"

"Is it not discrimination to force a child to transfer from a nonpublic school to a public school as a condition for receiving the benefits of Federal aid funds allocated on his behalf?"

Barefoot Child Pilgrims Walk 'Holy Mile'

London — (NC) — For the first time since the Reformation a children's pilgrimage has been made to the shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham, Norfolk.

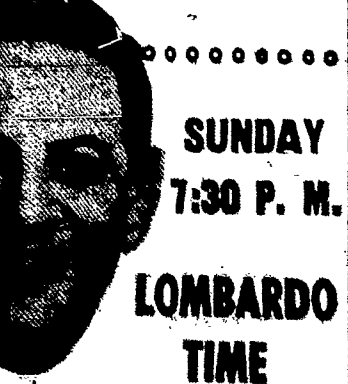
Some 200 children went there from Corby, Northamptonshire. Their object was to ask Our Lady to help them raise the 150,000 pounds (\$600,000) needed to build Catholic schools in their town, which has the largest proportional Catholic child population in the country.

Religion Belongs In Radio, Bishops Hold

Munich — (NC) — Broadcasting must accord a proper share to religion in the fashioning and maintenance of the Christian culture of the West, says a message of Bishop Wilhelm Berning of Osnabrueck, who is in charge of press and radio matters for the Fulda Conference of the German Hierarchy. The message was sent to a meeting of religious broadcasters held here under the auspices of American military government.

"It is not enough to carry church programs on the air at given hours," the Bishop wrote. "Everything opposed to the Christian sentiments of the listeners should be kept off the air, and at the same time, more attention should be devoted to Christian tradition in literature, the arts, music and other fields."

SWEDEN MAY LIFT BARS ON CATHOLICS

Frankfurt — (NC) — A bill which would permit the establishment of monasteries and convents in Sweden is to be submitted soon to the Stockholm parliament, according to reports of German religious news services.

Swedish Catholics still are considerably restricted in their freedom. None can teach in the primary schools. To get a passport a Catholic must first apply to a Lutheran pastor for a certificate of good conduct, and Catholics are not permitted to marry even if the other party is a Catholic, unless banns are first published in the Lutheran church. No Swede can legally become a Catholic except after his intention of conversion has twice been made public in a Lutheran church.

If a Swedish parliament should now pass legislation allowing the establishment of monastic orders it may prove a considerable step toward restoring full freedom of worship.

Notre Dame Names Five Vice-Presidents

Notre Dame, Ind. — (NC) — Four new vice presidential positions have been established at the University of Notre Dame. It has been announced by the Rev. Thomas Steiner, C.S.C., provincial of the Holy Cross Fathers, who administer the institution. Previously one vice president served the institution.

The vice presidents are the Revs. Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C., executive vice president; John H. Murphy, C.S.C., vice president in charge of public relations; Howard Kenna, C.S.C., vice president in charge of academic affairs; John J. Burke, C.S.C., vice president in charge of business affairs; and Joseph A. Kehoe, C.S.C., vice president in charge of student welfare.

Cartier's Grave Said Found In St. Malo

Ottawa — (NC) — The grave of Jacques Cartier, famous navigator and explorer who claimed Canada for France in 1534, has been reported discovered in the cathedral of St. Malo in France.

Gustave Lanctot, former Canadian archivist and authority on Cartier, said on his return from France that he was almost certain that he had found the explorer's skeleton, preserved nearly intact in lime.
