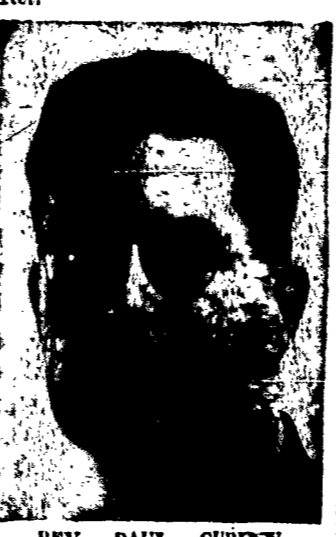
Spinosa - Temple
