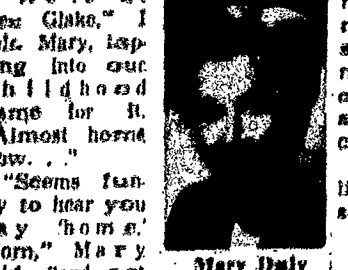

At Our House
A Visit to Grandma's

Mary Stretch and I sat on the edges of the seats, almost pushing the train along. There was the warning whistle — Big Lake where we used to swim in the summer and where in the winter, watch the trains go by and listen for this same piping whistle.

"We're at New Glaze," I told Mary. "I'm going into our old home for a moment." "Almost home now," she said. "Seems funny to hear you say 'home' now." "Of course it couldn't seem like home to you; you hadn't been there since you were a baby. But would it ever seem like a second home to her — the way our Grandma's home had seemed to us? Maybe not; for as authorities tell us continually, children are too sophisticated nowadays, they have so much more to interest them than we did. Would Mary be bored in a small midwestern town in the heat of summer?"

IT WAS different when we were children. There were no television shows and radio, no organized camp activities and only occasional silent flickering movies. A visit to Grandma's in those days was the peak of our summer.

I thought of those visits the other day when the busy train chugged in a shoe box. How glad Grandma was to see us! The thrill of playing with Mary's old dolls and of hearing what she did when she was a little girl; how we would be dressed in our best and taken to call on Mama's friends, with a stern warning to "behave yourselves" how we'd be looking over and asked how we were and then dispersed again.

Our good features were always traced to Mama's side of the family and nothing was said of the bad one, but I felt guilty that poor Papa was blamed for Grandma's wrinkles and for my plumpness. Mama loved those visits to Iowa City and we did too. We had a sense of "being home."

THE WEDDING committee was there with outstretched arms: Mama and Margaret, Aunt Mary and Aunt Aurelia; my brother Hubert and his wife. Next day we showed Mary the town. The familiar streets and stores and houses looked so reassuring to her, just as they always had been — but how did they look to Mary in contrast to the modern apartment houses.

A FIRST LADY INTERVIEWED

Old St. Mary's Claims First To Airconditioning

Old St. Mary's Church in Rochester is actually the first air-conditioned Catholic Church, parishioners noted this week, correcting a recent news story which named a Brooklyn church as the first.

The account in a New York City paper said that the Regina Pacis Shrine now under construction in Flatbush, was having installed the first air conditioning ever put in a Catholic Church, a statement successfully challenged by Old St. Mary's goers.

The air conditioning system installed in 1947 in the Rochester Church by the Rev. Dr. George D. Kottell, pastor, made St. Mary's not only the first, but presently the only church in the state so equipped. It is also the first Catholic church in the United States to install such equipment, although Baptist churches in Omaha, Neb., and Wichita, Kan., now have the system.

Priest Home From Rome

Rev. Robert W. Schiefel, a St. Bernard's alumnus who has been studying at the Belgium College in Rome, is at home after two years visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gerard F. Schiefel, 113 Gilbert Dr., Irondequoit.

Father Schiefel stopped over in Rochester on his way to St. Augustine, Fla., to which Diocese he is assigned. He has been studying canon law in Rome and has one more year of study to obtain a doctorate in canon law.

In Rochester he officiated last Saturday at the wedding of his sister, Miss Jean Marie Schiefel, and Stanford E. Murray in St. Ambrose Church.

Ordained in October, 1946 from St. Bernard's, Father Schiefel was assigned to the St. Augustine Diocese.
