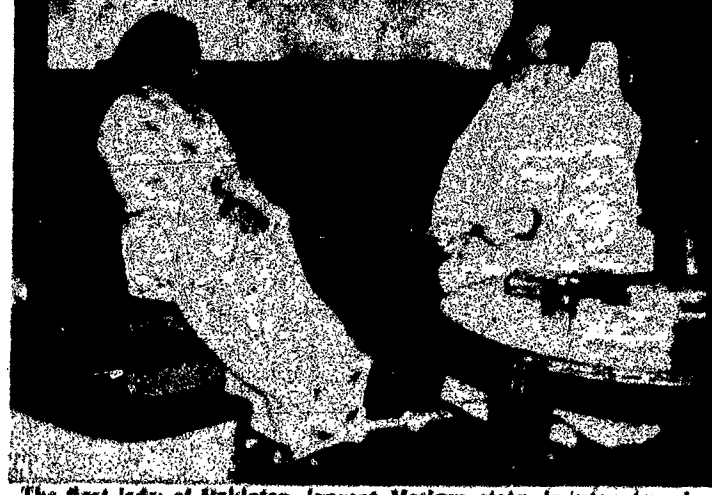

**A FIRST LADY INTERVIEWED**

**Old St. Mary's Claims First To Airconditioning**

Old St. Mary's Church in Rochester is actually the first air-conditioned Catholic Church, parishioners noted this week, correcting a recent news story which named a Brooklyn church as the first.

The account in a New York City paper said that the Regina Pacis Shrine now under construction in Flatbush, was having installed the first air conditioning ever put in a Catholic Church, a statement successfully challenged by Old St. Mary's goers.

The air conditioning system installed in 1947 in the Rochester Church by the Rev. Dr. George D. Kettell, pastor, made St. Mary's not only the first, but presently the only church in the state so equipped. It is also the first Catholic church in the United States to install such equipment, although Baptist churches in Omaha, Neb., and Wichita, Kan., now have the system.

In Rochester he officiated last Saturday at the wedding of his sister, Miss Jean Marie Schiefen and Stanford E. Murray in St. Ambrose Church.

Ordained in October, 1946 from St. Bernard's, Father Schiefen was assigned to the St. Augustine Diocese.
