Camp Stella Maris Boasts Of 'Finest Waterfront'

 "Come On In—The Water's Fine!" This phrase may be an old one, but the thrill of a cool swim on a hot Summer's day is always new, fresh, and exciting. Wherever it may be, the "Old Swimmer's Hole" is one of our fondest childhood memories.
 Camp Stella Maris, the ocean summer camp operated by Catholic Charities on Conesus Lake, boasts one of the finest waterfronts available in any part of the state. The Stella Maris waterfront is tops in fun and tops in safety because it is well equipped, well guarded and excellently fitted by nature.
 LET'S LOOK over a sample of the varied activity to be found there on a typical day in July and August. You supply the background yourself—a warm day, bright sunlight dancing on the waves, and the light touch of a Summer breeze. The fingers of the glistening white dock provide a striking contrast with the blue of the water and sky, and the light sandy beach.
 About ten o'clock every morning, you will find the shallow water within the first division occupied by the small fry—the "cribbars." Here Mickey Daly, American Red Cross water safety instructor, teaches the youngest campers the fundamentals of swimming.
 TODAY THEY are eagerly practicing the "dead man's float," and finding out that it's easy to duck under water and open their eyes. Tomorrow they may be trying their first Advancement Test—swimming fifty feet in the next division.
 This will entitle them to move out into deeper water where they will learn new strokes and the fundamentals of diving under the able direction of Dan Torrey, American Red Cross lifeguard.
 Once in awhile, as the fifty footers practice their strokes, you can see their envious glances directed toward the last division, "the 100 yard area." This swim section is their goal—the Final Achievement.
 Boys capable of swimming at least 100 yards may use the springboard and the 12-foot diving tower. Here they may learn the Red Cross requirements for
