
Fr. Martin Assigned To Toronto Charge

St. Bona Grads Hear Talk On Social Justice

St. Bonaventure, N.Y.—Attacking those who are striving to maintain the status quo in America, Dr. Egon Plager, professor of sociology at Siena College, called for "practical social justice for all" and "security for society as a whole."

The 45-year-old Vienna-born educator delivered the baccalaureate address at the summer commencement Sunday, August 3, at St. Bonaventure College, which conferred on him the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

Seventy-one graduates and undergraduate students also received degrees in ceremonies presided over by Rev. Msgr. James M. Powers of Erie, Pa.

Two other decorated were conferred, one on Msgr. Powers, Doctor of Laws, and another Doctor of Letters, on Mother M. Ignace Holtus of the Netherlands, Superior General of the Sisters of St. Francis of Penance and Christian Charity.

"WE MUST SEE to it that measures are enacted to make social justice practical, and to bring security to the multitudes," Dr. Plager declared. "The industrial might of America must serve the multitudes. Business must develop a social consciousness and be aware of its community responsibilities. We must rid ourselves of our race prejudice and we must care for the needy."

In a society where justice and charity prevail, communism as a political or economic force is not a threat, the Sienan professor said. He condemned those who hold that depressions and mass unemployment are "Acts of God."

"They are produced by us in our inhuman economic practices," he asserted; adding: "If men can avoid depressions, then bold statesmanship."

Pittsford Parish Buys Site For Planned Church, School

Plans for a future new church building and a school for St. Louis parish, Pittsford, were being discussed this week following purchase of an historic residence on Main Street.

The present residence, located on Main Street, is owned by Mrs. Anna M. Coughlin, widow of the late James M. Coughlin, former Pittsford town supervisor. The residence is to be converted into a residence for the pastor.

Mr. and Mrs. Coughlin built the village residence during the 1920's as a summer home for Pittsford's priests.

James M. Coughlin served as pastor of the Pittsford church for 30 years by the Gleeson family, and later served as pastor of St. Agnes' Church. Some three years ago, it came into possession of the Shangraw family, present owners of the residence at Main Street.

Rev. Msgr. Powers of Erie, Pa., who used to be a Pittsford resident, advised it would be a good place to locate a parochial school.

On the occasion, the pastor and several relatives in the Gleeson family, Mr. and Mrs. George N. Gleeson, were present to accept the residence from Mr. and Mrs. Coughlin.

Through the years several residents have come along to help support the village landmarks. All of the interior woodwork and fixtures were brought in at tremendous expense. Great difficulty was had in getting the house ready for occupancy.

Frank K. Rhode succeeds Eugene F. Agan of Elmira who held the office for two years.

Besides being a past grand knight of Elmira Council, Knight of Columbus, Rhode is a former faithful navigator of Elmira Fourth Degree Assembly, a former president of Columbian Center. In recent years he has held the posts of Lecturer, Treasurer, Trustee and deputy grand knight of Elmira Council.

Thomas A. Crowley, faithful pilot of Elmira Assembly, has been chosen warden to the new district deputy.

Church of Jesus General, Tokyo — Plans are under way for a new Roman Catholic church in Kanazawa dedicated to the memory of Takeyama Unon, saintly Japanese general, who was one of the leading Catholics of Japan 300 years ago.

Meanwhile, a committee of non-Christians, as well as Catholics, is seeking to promote Unon's beatification cause, which was begun by the Japanese hierarchy three years ago.

Land near the parish treated a mission — Immaculate Heart of Mary Chapel — in Bushnell, Mich., where one Mass is celebrated every Sunday.
