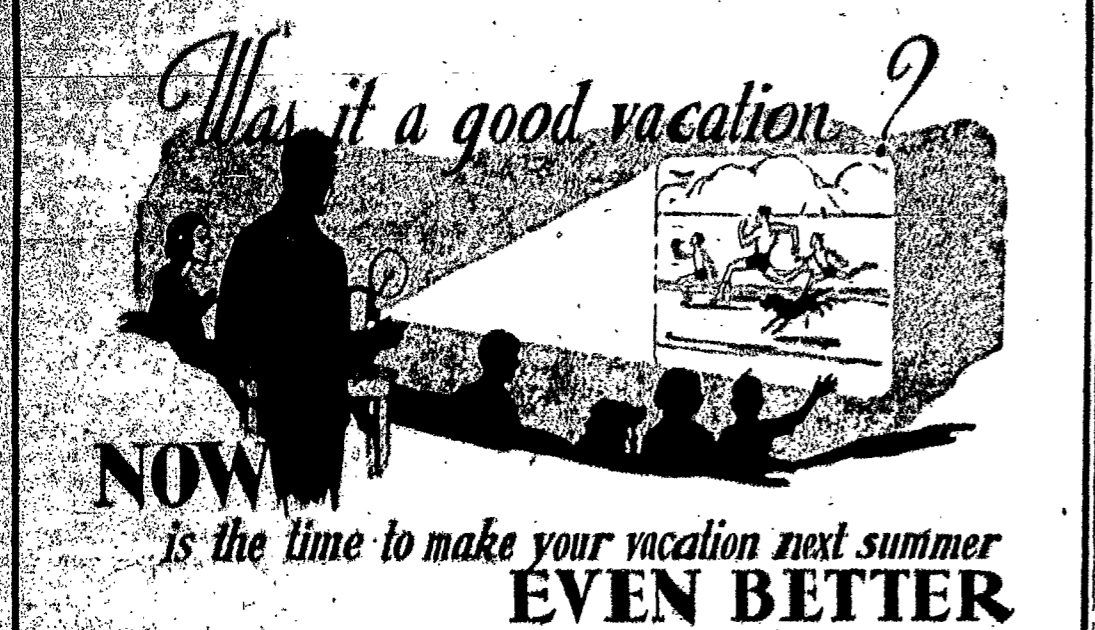


2,000 Attend AOH Irish American Day

(Continued from Page 7) The resolution deplored contraception and abortion, and commended the establishment of marriage forums in which "the sanctity of marriage and its dignity are preponderant over undue emphasis on the physical and sexual side of married life." It called upon Union members to train their marriageable sons and daughters in self-control by means of sacramental life. "Much has been said and written about the high cost of raising children in this day," the resolution added. "In very many instances, economic difficulties of family life are due in great part to the expenditures of alarming sums for amusements and luxuries that far exceed the bounds of moderation. The unwelcomed lust for pleasure is fast making us a nation of irresponsible prodigals."

IN AN ADDRESS before a Union session, Sister Maria De Rey, recently returned from a 10-month tour of Maryknoll missions in the Orient, declared that the Catholic Church is being driven underground in the face of the communist onslaught in China.

"There is not a shadow of a doubt," Sister Maria said, "that communism is taking hold in China and that South China, Korea, Japan, the Philippines and Formosa, too, will have to fight for their lives. "Three days before I left one Chinese village, the natives' novitiate there was turned into a hospital. A hospital might get by under a communist regime; the novitiate certainly could not."
