Priest Returns From Italy for First High Mass

First Solemn Mass of the Rev. Nicholas Arioli, C.P.P.S., first boy of Most Precious Blood Parish to be raised to the Holy Priesthood, will be celebrated Sunday, August 21 in the parish church, Stinson St. at Lexington Ave. at 10:30 a. m.

Father Arioli was ordained in St. John the Lateran Basilica in Rome, on June 19 and offered his first Mass in the native village of his parents Vallonvallelonga, Italy. He is the son of Joseph and Clara Arioli, 34 Stinson St., Rochester.

Arriving in the Mass Sunday will be Assistant Priest, the Very Rev. Angelo Della Vecchia, C.P.P.S.; Deacon, the Rev. Stefano Bianchi, O.F.M., a native of Vallonvallelonga, Italy and enroute to China to establish a seminary; Subdeacon, the Rev. Anthony Looco, C.S.B., and Master of Ceremonies, Michael Blondi, C.S.B., a classmate of Father Arioli when at Aquinas Institute.

The sermon will be preached by the Rev. Sebastian Contigiacomo, C.P.P.S., pastor of Most Precious Blood Church.

A reception will be held in the parish hall, from 3:30 p. m. to 7:30 p. m., Sunday.
