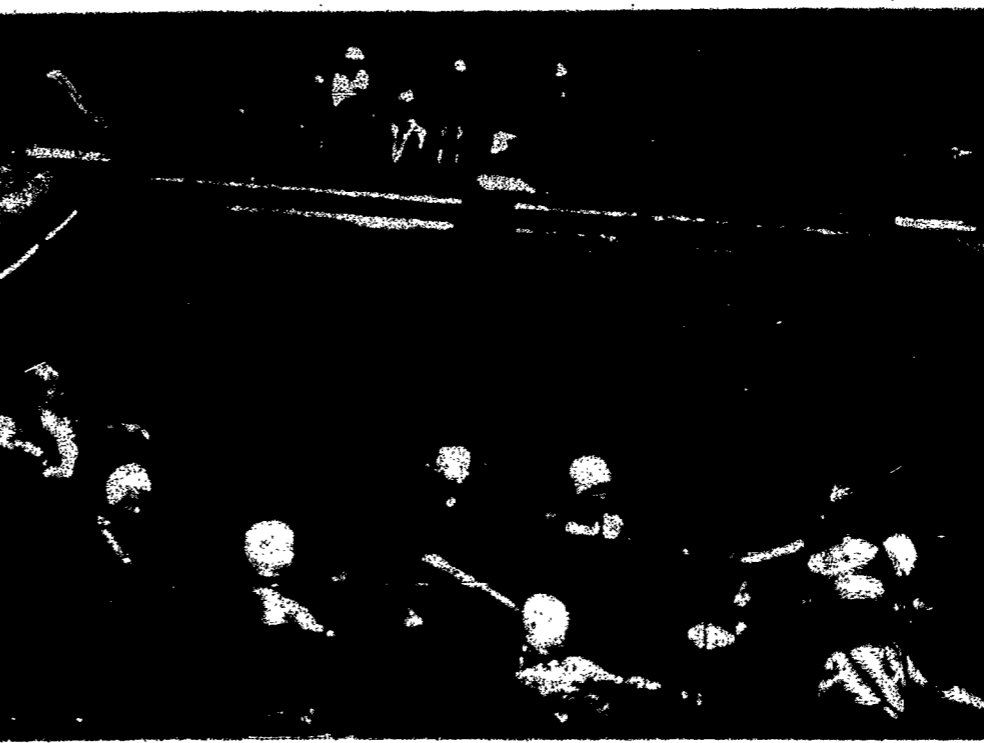

Priest Conducting One-Man Drive for Hard-of-Hearing

Washington — (NC) — Statistics, generally, are cold and heartless, but in this case they're downright astounding. Fifteen per cent of the U. S. population have impaired hearing — that's in the neighborhood of 21,000,000 persons.

THE STATISTICS were furnished by the Rev. Francis T. Williams, who has become a sort of one-man-campaigner to do something about the alarming situation, Father Williams, who is soon to receive his doctorate in philosophy for research work in deaf education from Fordham University, is director of the Institute for Preparation of Teachers for the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing now in its second year at the Catholic University of America.

Father Williams makes it emphatically plain that there is a marked difference between the deaf and the hard-of-hearing. A deaf person, he explained, generally is one born without the sense of hearing, while one who is hard-of-hearing generally is one whose sense of hearing has become impaired since birth, and who may lose it unless the defect is detected in time and treated.

On a comparatively small scale, Father Williams said, something is being done in the nation to aid the deaf. He said there are 204 special schools for the deaf in the United States, 10 of which are Catholic institutions, and 18,316 pupils, of whom 1,338 are Catholics, in these schools. But what about the hard-of-hearing?
