Nun From Here Asks Books For African School

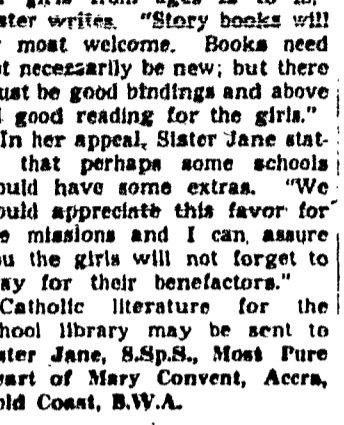
An urgent appeal from a Rochester-born missionary nun in Africa for books to stock a school library has been received by the Very Rev. John S. Handall, diocesan director, Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

The sister is Sister Jane LeFrois, S.Sp.S. of the Mission, Servants of the Holy Ghost who left Rochester in August 1945 to serve in the African missions.

"What we want most is books for girls from ages 12 to 18," Sister writes. "Story books will be most welcome. Books need not necessarily be new; but there must be good bindings and above all good reading for the girls."

In her appeal, Sister Jane stated that perhaps some schools would have some extras. "We would appreciate this favor for the missions and I can assure you the girls will not forget to pray for their benefactors."
