Rosary Workshop Units Set Up By 'Family Theater'

Hollywood, N.C.—The third floor of the Family Theater office here has been converted into a Rosary Workshop, equipped with large tables where volunteers make rosaries in their spare time. A new and novel system for assembling rosaries by hand has been devised to make them durable and inexpensive.

Since its inception a few weeks ago approximately 300 people have offered their services on regular schedule, about half of them coming to the Family Theater Workshop, the other half preferring to work at home because of health or other disabilities.

Similar projects will ultimately be joined across the country as soon as the Family Theater Workshop can supply the trained instructors.

Rosary Said On Radio

New Orleans—(NC)—Daily broadcast of the Rosary was resumed permanently recently to Station WJMV. The Metropolitan Council of the Holy Name Society will be in charge. It will be at 6:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday and at 8 p.m. Sunday. Holy Name groups from white and Negro parishes will take turns leading in the recitation.

Bantu Mass Aired On Dutch Radio

The Hague—(CIP)—A Bantu Mass, containing the rhythmic music and melodies of the African Congo is expected to open the way to a fuller appreciation of the worship of God among converted Bantu natives. Composed by Father A. Walschap, M.S.C., who died in 1930, the Bantu Mass was broadcast here for the first time August 5 by the Catholic Broadcasting Corporation (KIRO).

Hailed as a pioneer in his field, Father Walschap spent most of his spare time as a missionary among the Bantus learning their traditional songs and rhythms. His composition, containing the Latin hymns of the prescribed Mass hymns, set to music understood by Bantus. The Bantu Mass is considered the first major musical contribution in the missions. Although there have been many religious art works in both African and Chinese traditions, there have been few musical compositions for Church use employing motifs familiar to mission countries. Reds Threaten Lepers' Home Twice Rebuilt by U. S. Priest

Kongmoon, China—(NC)—Will the Gate of Heaven leproarium be closed in the face of lepers a third time? That is the question facing a Maryknoll missionary here, the Rev. Joseph A. Sweeney of New Britain, Conn. Twice this year a typhoon has destroyed the leper colony. The date of Heaven's Now, with the advance of communist troops into South China, Father Sweeney faces a possibility that his colony will be destroyed a third time.

FATHER SWEENEY has worked among the lepers in South China since 1923. His first assignment, for 20 patients, was in a dark bamboo grove near the city of Tol Shan. After three years there, the Chinese government recognized the Maryknoll's work by offering him 300 virgin acres at the Moon on an island at the mouth of Kongmoon River, a remote spot ideal for his leproarium.

Father Sweeney cleared the ground for his new colony, and began to erect permanent buildings. A typhoon, struck Gao Moon at midnight on September 2, 1937. Before dawn, the wind again lashed with ategia,

Reds Attack 'Iron Curtain' Film

The Hague—(CIP)—The Netherlands Communist Party, which has encouraged picketing and disturbances at theaters showing "The Iron Curtain," has now published a leaflet entitled "The Terror of the Police in the Showing of the Iron Curtain." The leaflet is being distributed both here and in Amsterdam, the main stronghold of Dutch Communists.

Police arrested three Communists who helped start a riot in the Rialto Cinema in Amsterdam several weeks ago, and had to employ mounted police and hard rubber nightsticks to disperse the crowd of protestors outside of the theater.
