

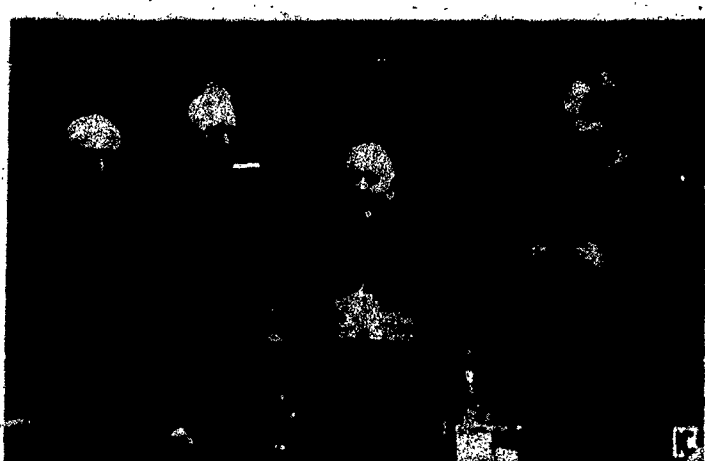

Police Replace Bishop's Aide

London (NC) — Details of the "virtual imprisonment" of which Archbishop Josef Beran of Prague complained in his widely publicized letter to the Czechoslovak State Prosecutor are contained in a letter here from Prague.

The Archbishop's doorman has been removed from his post by the regime and assigned to work in the garden, the letter relates, while two sturdy communist guards have taken over as doormen. These have precise instructions as to whom to admit into the palace, the letter says.

In case of doubt they telephone the police for instructions. Unknown visitors to the palace are told that the Archbishop wishes to see no one and are turned away, the writer reports. He says that several priests who came from the country carrying suitcases were taken to police headquarters for questioning.

The Archbishop still celebrates Mass in his private chapel, the letter says, and spends his days in his rooms or in his garden. The number of visitors permitted to see him has been reduced to a minimum.

Priest Discusses Gelatin Eating On Abstinence Day — New York (NC) — Emphasizing that his conclusions are nothing more than his personal opinion, the Rev. Martin S. Welsh, O.P., of Providence (R.I.) College, in an article published in The Homiletic and Pastoral Review, speculates on whether eating certain kinds of gelatin violates the Church law on days of abstinence.

FATHER WELSH points out that some gelatin is derived from fruit jellies and therefore not forbidden on a day of abstinence. But there are other gelatins, he points out, which are obtained from prolonged boiling of the soft parts of animals, and it is these he concerns himself with in the article.

"He cites the law of the Church as forbidding the use of meat or 'extracts of meat,' but adds that 'the law does not require nor desire that we resort to a chemical analysis of certain articles of food in order to determine its contents for the sake of comparing it with some standard meat composition.'"

THE AUTHOR comments: "In general, the material of animal origin is classified as fish (even frogs' legs are admitted in that category) but, according to the common judgment of men, a hippopotamus would scarcely be placed in the species of fish, even though it spends much of its time in water."

FATHER WELSH says that regarding the gelatin question "we are not considering the chemical changes which take place in the preparation of gelatin, but only the actual concrete collection of animal substances which are subjected to the process of continual boiling and which result in the formation of gelatin."

FATHER WELSH comes to "the practical conclusion that gelatin is certainly made up of the meat of warm-blooded animals; and if a small amount of acid is employed previously to soften the bones, that does not alter the consequence that the product is still to be classified as an extract of animal meat."
