Priest Appeals For Expellees In Native Germany

The plight of 2,500 priests expelled from countries behind the Iron Curtain into British and American zones of Germany was brought this week before members of the New York State Branches, Catholic Central Union and National Catholic Women's Union, by a priest who spent nine months in Siberia.

He is the Rev. Gerhard A. Fittkau who is touring the United States in the interests of the St. Boniface Society and makes his American headquarters at Techny, Ill. He spoke at the convention of the two organizations in Rochester.

ORDAINED MOSTLY before the war, Father Fittkau was in a parish in East Prussia in the Diocese of Ermland. Of the original 400 priests in that diocese, 58 were killed by the Nazis and 122 by the Russians, he reported to the Verein.

Eighty per cent of the persons sent from East Prussia to Siberia are dead and of the 20 per cent returned to Germany only 2 per cent are alive, he said.

Father Fittkau's plea is for the 12,000,000 persons of German descent who, because of the Potsdam agreement, have been expelled into the British and American zones and are struggling for bare existence.

The priests among these people, he said, are forced to say Mass in basements and to use wine cups for chalices and cigar boxes for tabernacles. People sometimes walk as far as 12 miles to assist at Mass.

Father Fittkau is secretary general of the St. Boniface Society at 21a Padernorn, Neuhausenerstr. 23, British Zone of Germany.

Ray Flynn Appointed Coach Of Holy Family Grid Team

Auburn — Ray Flynn, well known and popular local sportsman, has been appointed head football coach at Holy Family High School, according to Rev. Alfred Horr, director of athletics at the school. The players will meet with Coach Flynn at 3 p. m. Thursday at the "Y" Field when all candidates for the varsity have been asked to report for initial practice.

Coach Flynn is no stranger to Holy Family or local sport fans. He played football at Auburn High and Christian Brothers Academy of Syracuse where he was named All-Scholastic tackle. Ray later played semi-pro football and then joined his brother, Johnny Flynn as grid coach at Holy Family.

THE STOCKY BUILT Ray also starred in baseball and basketball. He returned recently from Michigan where he worked following his discharge from the Army after World War II. Coach Flynn has again taken up residence in his home town and is back in the local sports limelight.

THIRTY STUDENTS enrolled for the first Fall term are expected to arrive on Tuesday, Sept. 13. Registration for day students is scheduled Friday, Sept. 9.

Seven Corning students have registered for the first year. They will be day students and will travel to and from Corning in a station wagon. A new school bus has been purchased from Padua High School.

Alterations have been going forward. The main building of the Springs, once the music room, has been made into a chapel. Classrooms, library, dining room and kitchen a sick room, student dormitories and school offices are being put into shape.

St. Anthony's Seminary and Padua High School has as one of its prime objectives the preparation of youths for the priesthood. Other students, however, are being accepted. All requirements of the State Board of Regents will be met.

It is planned to add one class a year to the curriculum so that by 1953 a full high school course will be offered.

AID FOR THE 12 million ethnic Germans expelled from Germany since the Potsdam agreement was urged and objection was made to the dismantling of some German industrial plants.

Resolutions of homage to His Holiness Pope Pius XII and gratitude to Bishop Kearney were also adopted.

Taking part in the proceedings was Albert J. Staller of New York City, national CCAU president. Presiding were Bernard F. Janzen of Glendale over the Central Union and Mrs. Mary Neubauer over the National Catholic Women's Union. Both were re-elected.

Joseph H. Gervais, Rochester attorney was elected state recording secretary. William Roeger, Rochester, general chairman of the convention, was elected honorary vice-president. Charles T. Troff, former state president, is one of three honorary presidents.

A HIGHLIGHT of the convention was a Eucharistic procession.
