

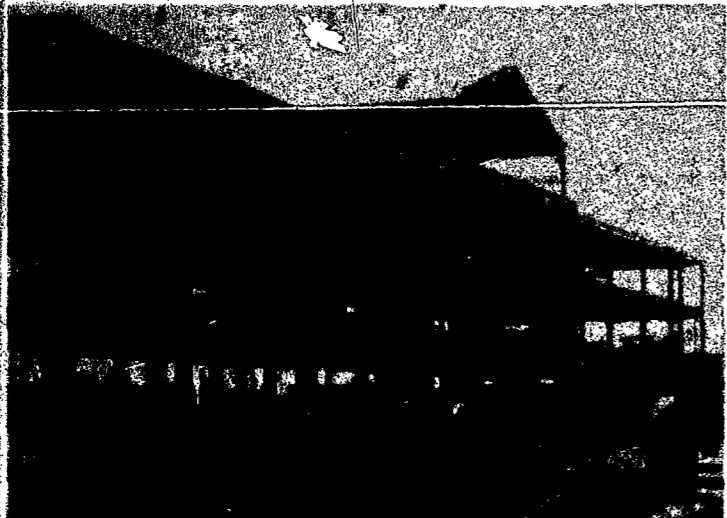
64 Retreatants Set New Record At Geneva House

Newman Club members have a particular dignity "as workers for Christ" and a responsibility "to spread the Faith," His Excellency Bishop Kearney told 500 delegates at the 35th national convention of the Newman Club Federation last week in Chicago.

Bishop Kearney, Episcopal Moderator of the Federation, conveyed to the delegates the blessings of Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston, chairman of the NCWC Youth Department, who is on a pilgrimage to Ireland.

Declaring that Newmanites should be leaders on the campus and beware of inconsistencies in their actions, Bishop Kearney said they should see to it that fellow students do not start neglecting their religious duties by their example.

Four priests of Rochester Diocese attended the sessions. They were the Rev. Donald M. Cleary and the Rev. Charles Langworthy, representing the Newman Club of Cornell University; the Rev. Paul Tulle, representing the Newman Club of the University of Rochester; and the Rev. Paul Cuddy, chaplain of the Newman Club at former Saratoga College.

Monthly study programs on problems of current interest was advocated in one of several resolutions adopted at the four-day conclave. Panels, a workshop and plenary meetings featured the sessions.
