Lincoln, Neb. - (RNS) - Attorney General James H. Anderson's interpretation of Nebraska's anti-gambling laws "is illogical and unjust" so long as it bars bingo games, according to the Rt. Rev. Magr. Maurice W. Helmann, editor of the Southern Nebraska Register, official paper of the Diocese of Lincoln.
