Joseph Stalin Conversion Prayers Asked

New York (NC)—A plea for prayers for Josef Stalin was addressed to listeners to the Sunday Hour of Faith program on NBC by the Rev. Michael J. Lee, diocesan director of youth of Wichita, Kan. "I know of the horrible outrages perpetrated in some parts of Europe," Father Lee said. "I know that murder, defilement and blasphemy are the order of the day. The love of Christ on the Cross is being insultingly hurled back into His sacred face. "But my request is: please pray for the Russian dictator. The Devil wants his soul. His deeds may be as black and ugly as the blasphemies of Calvary, but Jesus died for that soul. "How can we dare hate a soul that Christ died for? Certainly, this man is our enemy, but Christ made a new way, pray for your enemies. The Good Shepherd will leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go to seek that soul which has strayed away."

Priests Urge Ouster of Left-Wing Union Leaders

Orange, N. J.—(RNS)—A call for the ouster of left-wing leaders in the national CIO-United Electrical Workers Union was sounded in two Roman Catholic churches here. Both parishes—Our Lady of the Valley and Our Lady of Mount Carmel—have a number of members who belong to the UE local at the Monroe Calculating Machine Co. here, and the ouster statements were said to have been read at their request. The Rev. Francis F. Boland, assistant pastor of Our Lady of the Valley, urged his union member-parishioners to "beat the Reds at their own games." He called for the election of UE officers who "support democratic Christian principles rather than those who follow the Moscow line." Like the Very Rev. Andrew F. Petralia, pastor of Mt. Carmel, Father Boland urged union members to attend a meeting in West Orange to instruct delegates to the UE convention in Cleveland to join in "cleaning out the leftists." Earlier, the Rev. William C. Helmshutz, pastor of St. Michael's church, Elizabeth, urged his UE parishioners to bring about the defeat of "Red leaders" at the national convention. St. Michael's is located in the Elizabethport section, where the Singer Manufacturing Co. plant has been struck 21 weeks. The strike, called by UE Local 401, involves over 9,000 workers.

UN Articles Advocating Birth Control Draw Protest

The Hague, Holland—(NC)—Advocates of birth control "are proposing to the people of the world practices which are in radical opposition to the Divine Law to which our millions of members have given their faith," declares Mrs. F. Steenberghe, president of the International Union of Catholic Women's Leagues of the Hague, Holland. "We cannot help wondering," the letter continues, "if since some countries would oppose this anti-birth trend while others would support it, a disequilibrium would not arise to endanger future peace. "I WRITE in the name of the Board of the IUCWL to raise an energetic protest against this orientation and to explain to you the deplorable effect that it will have in all countries on the millions of wholesome women. Their confidence in UNESCO would be destroyed if the latter used its powerful means of action in the service of a solution which is contrary to the natural law. The National Council of Catholic Women in the United States, comprising 19 national organizations and 78 diocesan councils, is affiliated with the International Union.

German Scientist Flees Soviet Zone

Berlin—(CPI) The latest addition to a long list of prominent Germans who have escaped from the Soviet Zone to seek refuge in Western Germany is Dr. Lothar Oertel, a famous scientist whom the Communist authorities of the Soviet Zone recently proposed to the Nobel Committee of the Swedish Academy of Sciences as a candidate for a Nobel Prize.
