\$6,500 Organ Installed In Holy Trinity, Webster

A new custom-built \$6,500 organ in Holy Trinity Church, Webster, has been installed to replace an organ that came from England in the early 19th century.

Made of light oak to harmonize with the interior of the church, the new organ, has 460 stops (an ordinary organ has 87 stops). Installation was under the direction of Prof. Philip Kreckel, organist and choir master of St. Boniface Church, Rochester.

Set New Parcel Post Rates For Germany

Changes in parcel post rates to Germany are announced by Postmaster Donald A. Dalley.

Effective at once, parcel post packages other than Gift Parcels (Commercial) and printed matter may be mailed to the American, British and French sectors of Berlin, Germany, at the following rates and weight limits:

Parcel Post rate, 14 cents per pound, weight limit 22 lbs.

Printed matter rate, 14 cents for each 2 ounces, weight limit 6 pounds 9 ounces.

Articles of printed matter and commercial parcels for Berlin must show "American Sector," "British Sector" or "French Sector" as part of the address.

Purge of Hungarian Protestants Reported

London — (RNS) — Hungarian Communists are conducting a far-reaching purge of Protestant leaders in that country, according to a Vatican Radio Polish-language broadcast.

The Vatican Radio quoted a secret report sent to Swiss Protestants by their fellow churchmen in Hungary to the effect that some clerics were compelled to cooperate with the Communist regime, while others were forced to retire from public and religious life.

During the last six months, the station quoted the report, 25 Protestant churches and periodicals were forced to suspend publication. The Communists then put out a new daily called The Protestant Church, to fill the void created by the suspensions. In addition, the government banned the import of foreign Protestant periodicals.
