gifts of different families, adorn the entrances of the church.  
IN THE SIDE Chapels of Our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph, the walls are plain with the same design on the ceilings as in the body of the church. The altars in the chapels are done in an eggshell white to correspond with the finish of the High Altar. The statues on the side altars as well as the other statues in the church were all finished in an eggshell white and then glazed in a soft antique finish.  
The pews of the church are of solid oak. During the Flood of 1940 the water completely covered them damaging the finish, but because of their solid construction they were unharmed.  
During the redecoration of the church the pews were removed from the church and stripped entirely of their old stain and varnish. They were then restained and varnished. The effect now is that of new pews.  
The vestries were also part of the redecoration program. New rubber tile floors were laid in both before they were painted. In the priest's vestry the vestment case was refinished and adorned with new hardware. The baptistry, in the same room, was enclosed with a railing similar to the altar railing.  
Last but not least in the entire program, the heating system was completely revamped. New radiators of the motor driven air circulating type were installed in the church. A motor stoker has been installed in the boiler to insure a constant and even heat in the church.  
It is expected that in time for the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the parish, which will be celebrated on the Feast of Christ the King, Oct. 30, that the aisles of the church will be carpeted. The cost will be paid by a donation of a parishioner.

Corneto Tarquinia, Italy, January 13, 1872, and died in Montefiascone, March 25, 1732, and was buried in the Cathedral where she died.  
CANONIZED A SAINT by Pope PIPUS XI in 1933, Saint Lucia Filippini established 32 schools in Italy, all taught by her Community.  
A group of five Maestre Pie Filippini (Religious Teachers (Filippini) came to this country in 1910 and opened a school in the parish of St. Joachim at Tremont, N. J.  
The American Province of this Order has its Mother House, Novitate, Probation, Juniorate and Higher Community Preparatory schools at Villa Walsh, Morristown.  
They teach in the Elementary and Secondary schools established by the Institute and engage in Missionary activities. The Institute has foundations in the Archdioceses of New York and Baltimore and in the Dioceses of Tremont, Camden, Paterson, Cleveland, Rochester, Hartford, Ogdensburg, Providence, Scranton, Albany and Pittsburg.
