Two Lithuanian professors recently arrived from overseas, have been added to the faculty of Nazareth College. They are Romualdas Zalubas and Mrs. Viada Sabaliauskas.

Mrs. Sabaliauskas holder of a Master's degree in Slavic languages from the University of Vilnius and qualified to teach instrumental music will be a member of the Music Department faculty. She is planning to offer classes in Russian in the Adult Education program of the college, in which alumnae and other adults are invited.

Overseas Mail Dates Listed

Christmas mail for U. S. armed forces members overseas must be mailed between Oct. 15 and Nov. 15, to APO and Fleet Post Office. Postmaster Donald A. Dalley announces.

Parcels for delivery in Japan, in Korea and in the Pacific Islands must be in the mail not later than Nov. 1, while parcels for Navy and Marine Corps members serving in remote areas should be mailed not later than Oct. 15, the Rochester postmaster said. Christmas cards must be mailed in sealed envelopes at first class rate before Nov. 15.

Postmaster Dalley emphasized the necessity of packing in substantial boxes or metal containers, plainly printed or typed on the box wrapper, rather than on labels. A slip of paper containing the names of sender and addressee together with a list of contents of the parcel should be enclosed, he said. Use of money orders is urged, since currency should not be mailed overseas. Postal notes must not be sent overseas. Prohibited articles for mailing, in addition to the usual ones, are matches and lighter fluids, cigaretttes and tobacco products.
