The Sodality observed the beginning of October, month of the Rosary, with a demonstration of the Living Rosary Sunday evening. A congregation of 500 joined them in tribute to the Queen of Peace.

EACH DECADE was made up of five girls, attired in formal, and five boys dressed in suits and blue ties all carrying blue votive candles. They were led from the hall around Clark and Chemung streets, through the front doors of the church by a crossbearer and eight altar boys carrying burning candles.

Rev. James J. Marvin, Sodality moderator, acted as narrator and introduced the Rosary with the Apostle's Creed, said the Our Father's and Glorias and announced the mysteries.

Patricia Maloney sang an Ave Maria, accompanied at the organ by Mrs. Catherine Skelly. The sodalis sang hymns under direction of James Johnson.
