

St. Bonaventure To Dedicate New Seminary Sunday

St. Bonaventure, N. Y. (Special) The consecration of the new \$2,000,000 Christ the King Seminary will be held here in an elaborate ceremony Sunday, Oct. 16, at 10 a. m. The Very Rev. John Lombardi, O.F.M., announced today.

Hundreds of members of the hierarchy and clergy in New York and Pennsylvania, will attend the ceremony. The Most Excellent Bishop John P. O'Connor, C.S.C., of Buffalo, will officiate at the laying of the cornerstone, which will follow a Mass at 8:30 a. m. at St. Bonaventure, 1000 St. Nicholas St., at 10 a. m. Most Rev. John and Puerto Rico, is expected to be completed next year.

will preside at the throne during the Mass, whose celebrant will be Very Rev. Thomas Plossmann, O.F.M., Provisional of the Holy Name Province of the Order of Friars Minor.

Sermon will be delivered by Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph B. McIntyre, chancellor of the Canon Law Office and head of the clerical alumni of St. Bonaventure.

The new building, which will accommodate 200 seminarians, will follow a Mass at 8:30 a. m. at St. Bonaventure, 1000 St. Nicholas St., at 10 a. m. Most Rev. John and Puerto Rico, is expected to be completed next year.

St. Bonaventure's last seminary was destroyed by fire in 1930. Since that time, temporary quarters have been maintained in a portion of Devereux Hall, a college dormitory. The new building was started on November 1 last year.

A striking illustration of St. Agnes on page 4 is from the pen of A. P. Westbrook, a friend of the school.

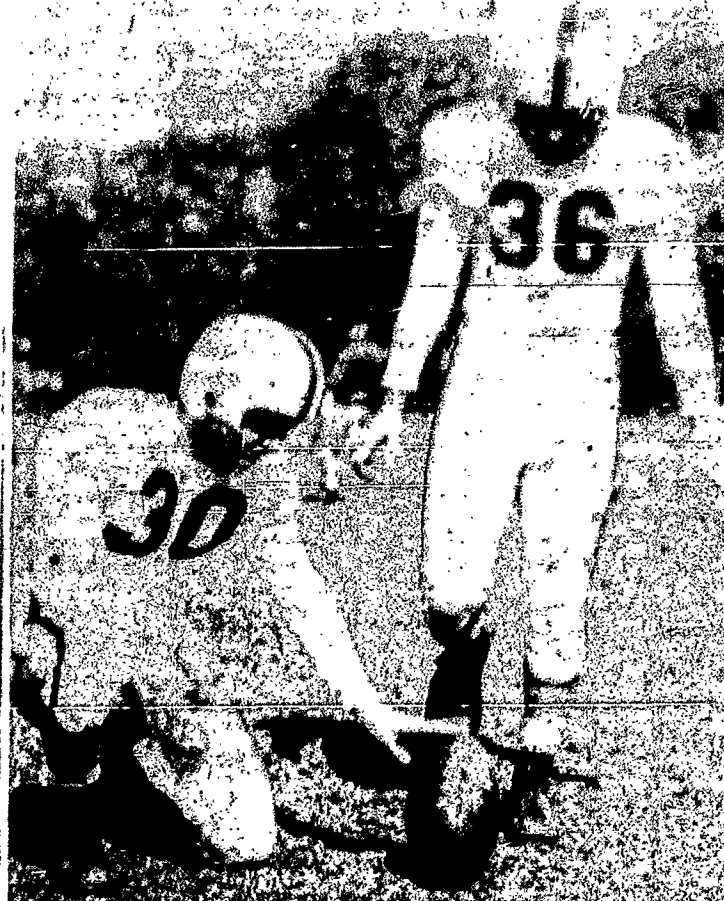

A threatening flock of Texas Eagles swarmed into the new Aquinas Memorial Stadium Sunday afternoon to tangle with Mickey Connolly's Aquinas gridders now riding the confident crest of two convincing victories.

POINTING FOR revenge on the 22-0 defeat of last year, St. Thomas High of Houston, Texas, is expected to display the trickiest hipper-dipper, crowd-pleasing football of the season for they boast a veteran team with two well trained backfields and Tommy Anderson, "the smartest quarterback in southern Texas."

Last Fall Aquinas fans watched the underdog Texans battle the Maroon with "formation deception that rivaled Houdini's clearest style. Although denied touchdowns on three scoring drives, Anderson, then second stringer playing his first major game, made the Irish dizzy with fakes, delayed reverses and short passes. His appearance this weekend surrounded by a better balanced, more experienced and bigger team will put the Aquinas defense to its first major test of the season.
