## Bishop Dedicates School In Ithaca

Members of the Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus, who provided an honor escort for the Bishop, and altar boys were also in the processions.

THE SCHOOL WAS open to public inspection for several hours Sunday afternoon, and Sister M. Alden, principal and other sisters who teach there, welcomed hundreds of visitors. The entrance steps lead to the first floor. Flanking the door are the two cornerstones, one dated 1883, the other 1948. On the first floor are classrooms for Grades 1 through 4 and the office of the principal. Three huge windows, plus fluorescent fixtures in the ceiling, light each room, which are done in pastel shades of green and peach. The corridors are in buff tile.

On the second floor are rooms for Grades 5 through 8 and a room for an overflow class of first and second-graders. In the old section, rooms have been remodeled and redecorated for the kindergarten, a library, a music room, and additional classrooms.

The basement is equipped with a kitchen and two adjoining lunchrooms, extra classrooms or meeting rooms, a storage room, and a vault.

The architect was John V. Larkin and the general contractor the War Construction Company. Other contractors were electrical, Norton Electric Company; plumbing and heating, Hill Heating & Plumbing Company; and painting and decorating, William M. Egan. Building materials were supplied by J. J. Driscoll Lumber Company, Cayuga Lumber Company, Driscoll Brothers & Co. and Robinson and Carpenter, all are of Ithaca.

## First Broadcast Of High Mass Goes Over WWHG

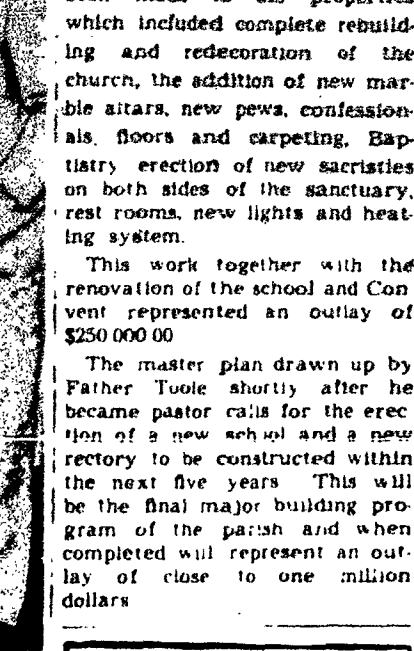

that Father Toole has been pastor a great many changes have been made to the properties which included complete rebuilding and redecoration of the church, the addition of new marble altars, new pews, confessionals, floors and carpeting, Baptistry erection of new sacristies on both sides of the sanctuary, rest rooms, new lights and heating system.

This work together with the renovation of the school and convent represented an outlay of \$250,000.

The master plan drawn up by Father Toole shortly after he became pastor calls for the erection of a new school and a new rectory to be constructed within the next five years. This will be the final major building program of the parish and when completed will represent an outlay of close to one million dollars.

## Sheehan's Mark 61st Anniversary

This year commemorates the 61st anniversary of Sheehan's Department store in Elmira.

Sheehan's is one of the oldest firms in existence in Elmira today. Originally known as Sheehan and Dean & Co., the store was founded in 1888 by three ambitious young men, Daniel Sheehan, Daniel Richardson and Elmer Dean.

Mr. Sheehan is still the president of the concern and his sons are managing it. Beginning Oct. 4, Sheehan's have been celebrating this their 61st Anniversary during which special values are being offered and souvenirs given.
